# 1916 Lecture Friday January 3rd

The 1916 Committee will be having a very special lecture. Once again we will be fortunate to hear form a native of Ireland who has lived experience dealing with British strong arm tactics and Unionist intransigence. And as we know, the century old forced partition has brought about discrimination in civil rights, law, employment, housing, language and culture. And during this lecture we will hear about how it has even affected the world of international athletics in Ireland.

Charles Breagy will speak on how England and the Unionists of the six counties created a Political Boundary rule that divided Irish Athletics into two separate athletic countries. Charles will explain how these political shenanigans caused Ireland to be banned from the Olympics in 1936. But we won't be hearing from an academic giving us an analysis of this situation but we will be hearing fascinating stories about how Charles' own athletic career was affected by this political gerrymandering. He will also explain why the Good Friday Agreement is a large part of the solution to unite the two athletic bodies that currently exist on the island of Ireland. He will conclude his lecture with a road map solution, using cycling as a sport that has resolved their split and returned to one organization representing all 32 counties.

It shouldn't be a surprise if the name Charles Breagy sounds familiar to many of our members. He is grew up in Ardee, Co Louth and started running at the age of 11 for the Dunleer Athletic Club. He won several all Ireland titles at all age groups and also represented his county in GAA football and hurling. Charles received a running scholarship to Providence College in 1980. Twice the Friars were runner ups in the US national cross country championships. Charles was also New England cross country and 3000 meter champion. After graduation Charles remained in RI and had a career as a software designer and programmer. But most people are familiar with his organization Run Rhody, an events company that organizes several large road races including the Tour de Patrick series with a 5K races before the local St Patrick's Day Parades. Many people in our group will have more than one running shirt from the many races Charles has organized over the years. The lecture will be followed by live music in the downstairs pub. Sean Connell will be at the mic.
